- Following the terrorist attacks of Sept 11, 2001, much economic activity moved from downtown Manhattan to downtown Brooklyn. The movement of businesses, institutions and traffic fueled a political conflict between residents and the city’s transportation agency. Spurred by the conflict, the NYCDOT was looking for alternatives they could explore to calm traffic and work with residents. My consultant team gathered evidence that compared models of transportation management associations (TMAs), which are rule-making partnerships between resident organizations and transit agencies. Findings were compiled into a policy decision report and featured in a briefing to the executive team of NYCDOT.

- The Drum Major Institute was interested in exploring the potential of expanding the New York State Earned Income Tax Credit to middle class families. As a contribution I co-built a mathematical model that simulated the state’s EITC system. This model allowed our consultant team to explore the costs and benefits of expanding the reach of the tax credit. Findings were compiled in an analytic report and were featured in a briefing presentation.
